Seminar Aims and Objectives

The Cyprus Fiduciary Association (<u>www.cyfa.org.cy</u>) is organizing an independent physical 3-hour seminar titled "Recent direct tax developments & the Draft EU UNSHELL Directive".

Aims and Objectives

The seminar aims to enhance the awareness of the participants to the recent direct tax developments made in Cyprus and internationally and in particular to enhance the knowledge and understanding of the participants to the draft EU Council Directive laying down the rules to prevent the misuse of shell entities for tax purposes and amending Directive 2011/16/EU. Despite the fact that the final Directive (if adopted) may differ from the current proposal, this seminar will address the importance of the provisions and rules laid down in the current proposal.

By the end of the seminar the participants will be given the opportunity to understand the main provisions of the new draft EU rules aiming to prevent the misuse of EU undertakings/shell companies which are presumably engaged with an economic activity but in reality do not conduct any actual economic activities; identify how these rules may affect/impact them and increase their ability to assess what steps need to be taken in order to be prepared once and if the Directive is adopted.
